

Hygiene measures for the leisure and tourism facilities in the Olympic Park Munich

Dear visitors,

The following hygiene measures apply until further notice when visiting our open leisure and tourism facilities:

Basically, our opening regulations are tied to the respective 7-day incidence in the state capital of Munich. If the stable incidence is below 100, the following regulations apply to the **Olympic Stadium Sightseeing (without guided tour), the Roof Climb Tour, the Roof Climb Tour with Flying Fox, the Stadium Tour and the Flying Fox (without Roof Climb Tour)**:

- You must have a current negative proof of testing (rapid test - max. 24 hours old or PCR test - max. 48 hours old) to visit. Testing is not required for fully vaccinated and recovered individuals and children under 6 years of age.
- FFP2 mask obligation applies. For children between the sixth and the 15th birthday, a mouth-nose-covering is sufficient.
- The usual hygiene rules apply, such as washing hands thoroughly and keeping your distance. Please also observe the sneezing and coughing etiquette.
- We ask you to keep the required distance of about 1.5 meters from other visitors as well as from our staff.
- Registration for contact tracing via <https://darfichrein.de/> or analog contact form is mandatory for visitors.
- If you feel ill and/or suffer from acute respiratory illnesses, please stay at home. You, as well as people who have had contact with Corona-infected persons in the past 14 days, are prohibited from visiting the recreational facilities.

TIP: For a visit to our facilities, and of course for other occasions, you can get tested at the Johanniter Rapid Test Center in the Olympic Park. Online registration via: www.schnelltest-olympiapark.de. The Rapid Test Center is located in the north of the Olympic Hall and can be reached barrier-free via a signposted footpath. Opening hours are based on demand and can be viewed daily at www.schnelltest-olympiapark.de.

Definition of fully vaccinated and recovered persons

Persons fully vaccinated against Corona are equal to persons tested negative as of day 15 after the final vaccination and are thus exempt from the testing requirements by the 12th BayIfSMV. The same applies to recovered persons with a positive PCR test at least 28 days and no more than 6 months ago.

How do I prove my status?

- **Proof of complete vaccination against COVID-19** with a vaccine approved in the EU can be provided from day 15 after the final vaccination by presenting a vaccination certificate in German, English, French, Italian or Spanish (on paper or electronically). This is the vaccination passport or vaccination card in which the vaccination is documented in accordance with § 22 IfSG. If no vaccination card is available at the time of vaccination, a vaccination certificate will be issued. This vaccination certificate is also suitable as proof of a complete vaccination.
- **Recovered persons** may prove their previous infection by submitting a document in German, English, French, Italian or Spanish (on paper or electronically), which clearly shows the positive PCR test. The result must be at least 28 days and no more than 6 months old. Alternatively, the certificate of isolation order (quarantine order by the health department) following a positive PCR test for SARS-CoV-2 may also be provided.
- **Recovered persons** who have been infected with SARS-CoV-2 for **more than six months** and who have already **received their first Corona vaccination** will be treated the same as fully vaccinated individuals. Proof can be provided by presenting the positive PCR test in conjunction with the vaccination certificate. The 14-day post-vaccination waiting period is waived for this population.

If a stable incidence value of less than 50 is reached in Munich, we will inform you here about the regulations that will then apply.
